


Pride of Place Festival

Are you interested in getting a Free Pendant Alarm?

Nascadh are delighted to announce that we are now a registered group with the Seniors Alert Scheme. We can now assist anyone over 65 interested in receiving a pendant alarm system in their home.

Pendant Alarms are monitored alarms for older people to help them remain safe in their own homes. They usually come in the form of a wrist band that you can push a button to ring through to a monitoring station. A person will talk through a speaker on the alarm to check if you are alright. If they do not get a satisfactory response they will contact one of your chosen contacts or the emergency services whichever is more appropriate.

Have you ever wondered whether you are getting the right social welfare payment or how to apply to get on the housing list. Nascadh CDP has developed a new service to provide information on government and other civil services. The Service is open from 10am - 12noon on Friday mornings. It is free and confidential. If these times do not suit you can make an appointment by calling 01 8893985.

The service has been used by many people so far and housing queries are the most frequent

We have had great success with our social and civil information service on Friday mornings in the Sean o Casey, situated on the fifth floor of the building. The most commonly asked question is about applying for housing and rent supplement. The rules for applying for housing are as follows;

The new rules are that since April of 2011 you can only apply to one local housing authority.

In general you must be already living in the area covered by that housing authority/ or have a connection with that area (as in grew up there or old family home there).

Only if your income is less than the threshold that applies in the housing authority's area and you must be in need of housing. There are 3 maximum income thresholds that apply to different housing authorities.

The grounds for getting housed are as follows

Your house has to be reasonable to live in or must meet the local authority's conditions.

If there is a marital breakup/divorce or separation and your own space is needed.

If the place you live in is overcrowded or is unfit for human habituation.

If a member of the household has a disability, mentally or physically

If you're current accommodation is an institution, emergency accommodation or a hostel

If you have Exceptional needs

Or you could be accepted on medical or compassionate grounds.

If you're current mortgage has been classified as unsustainable as part of (MARP) Laid down by the central bank.

To apply for local authority housing contact the housing Dept. of your local authority

For rent supplement you first of all need to be on the local authority's housing list before you apply

The local community welfare officer does not deal with rent supplements anymore. To apply for rent supplement you must write to, rent supplement unit, PO box 11905 Dublin 12
