Mick Byrne (27). The club's utility player, nine seasons with the club, can play in goal or forward, an excellent "clubman".



DINGLE UNITED



In Cabra, Dingle is a household word for they have brought great honour to the area. Their approach has always been extremely sporting and they have depended upon the dedication of their players to bring them to the top. In 1950 the club had its birth, with competition in the Leinster Junior Leagues, and three years later they moved to the AMATEUR LEAGUE where they won Division 1 in their initial season. Seeking further glory they moved to the Athletic Union League in 1974 and were runners-up in 1976

in Division 1A (Sunday). They are now proud members of the Premier Division. They have had many disappointments this year, not the least of which was their defeat by near neighbours, Beggsboro, in the Liddy Cup Final. This upset followed a replay in which Dingle were coasting to success with a 2-0 lead in the first game. They also were knocked out of the coveted F.A.I. Junior Cup somewhat unluckily at the hands of St. Patrick's C.Y.M.S. Dingle fell to Dunleary Celtic by the odd goal in five in the 1977 F.A.I. Junior Cup Final.

Maybe trophies on the sideboard have been scarce but success can seldom be measured by cups or shields. No greater motivator in the game at junior level at present is the Dingle Manager, Brian O'Neill. He is very confident that the A.U.L. premier trophy will rest in Cabra for at least a year ahead.

EAST WALL UNITED A.F.C.

The Club was founded in 1949/50 by a few enthusiastic and very talented footballers, namely Willie Gavin, Kevin Bermingham, Paddy "Boy" Constantine, Charlie Mulally and the late Harry Kavanagh. The Club's first Hon. Sec. was Mike Keegan. We are generally regarded as one of the country's most successful junior clubs having, over a period of 29 seasons, captured 28 trophies and being runners-up in 10 other competitions. However, our proudest record is that of never failing to fulfill a fixture even through our lean years and discipline and sportsmanship on and off the field.

The Club started in the Leinster League Div. 4 with a home ground in St. Anne's and over a period 1949-56 won all Divisions of the Leinster League and captured the Polikoff and William Sheeran Cups. In the season 1956/57 we transferred to the A.U.L. and won the Div. 1 Saturday and League Cup in our first season.

The most successful years were the sixties when we won the F.A.I. Junior Cup in 1964 and 1966. In 1964 season we also captured the Leinster Junior Cup and were runners-up in the League Cup and Div. 1 Saturday. The Club had the distinction and honour of providing 6 players for the A.U.L. panel which won the Oscar Traynor trophy for the first time. Season 1966-67 saw us achieve our greatest ambition to win the Glen Abbey for it had eluded us for 10 years.

In 1967-68 the A.U.L. formed the Premier League and requested competing clubs to have private grounds. We moved from St. Anne's to Santry and the move lost us a lot of support but we were more than compensated by winning the League and becoming first A.U.L. Premier champions. Over this period four players won international honours—Larry Kane, Pierce Godfrey, Joe Heavey and Richie Corrigan.

Trophies have been scarce during the seventies—1973-74 winners Premier League, 1974-75 runners-up, 1975-76 runners-up McEvoy Cup, 1976-77 Liddy Cup runners-up.
